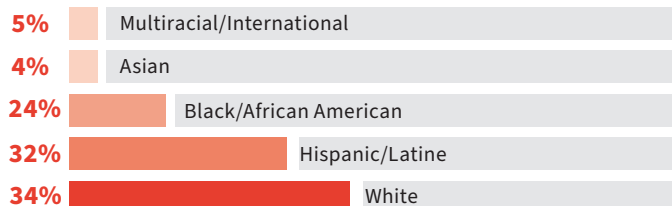

Ethnicity/Race



- 85%** Who complete FAFSA receive financial aid; **60%** receive Pell Grants
- 81%** Degree-seekers
- 79%** Attend part-time (credit students)
- 61%** Minority; we are a minority-majority institution; **11%** increase in students of color from last spring
- 57%** Work while going to school; **21%** parent while going to school; adult enrollment (25+) is up **12%** over last spring
- 42%** Receive Free Community College aid
- 30%** Latine; five of our campuses are Hispanic-serving institutions; we are in the process of applying for the distinction
- 28%** Attend classes at more than one campus (up from 1% before the merger)
- 6%** Have a disability or accommodation need
- 65%** Take at least one class online; **23%** fully online

Affordability

- Most affordable higher education option in the state – \$308/credit; \$5,218/year
- 45% of students paid \$0 in tuition and fees due to grant aid
- 13,003 Free Community College students served, totalling \$23,003,321 in funding
- Students receiving Free Community College tuition assistance have a 12% higher retention rate and 6% higher graduation rate than other CT State students
- Rated the #3 community college system by Wallet Hub, based on affordability and success
